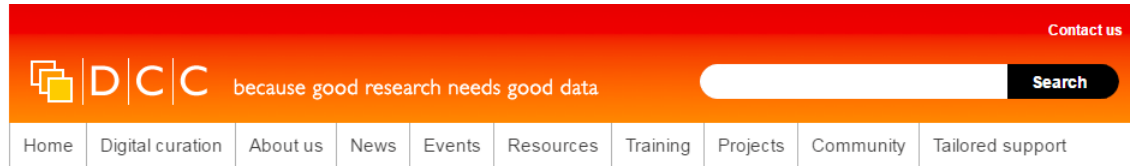

Visionary researchers and practitioners are tackling the remaining barriers.

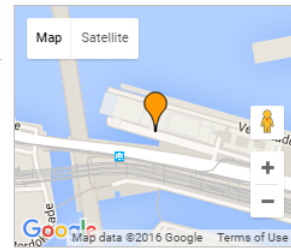
The success of this transition might be measured in two ways. First, is data recognised as a valuable scholarly output, enjoying the same visibility and prestige afforded to journal papers? Second, is the digital curation infrastructure so well embedded and supported that everyone can use it without a second thought?

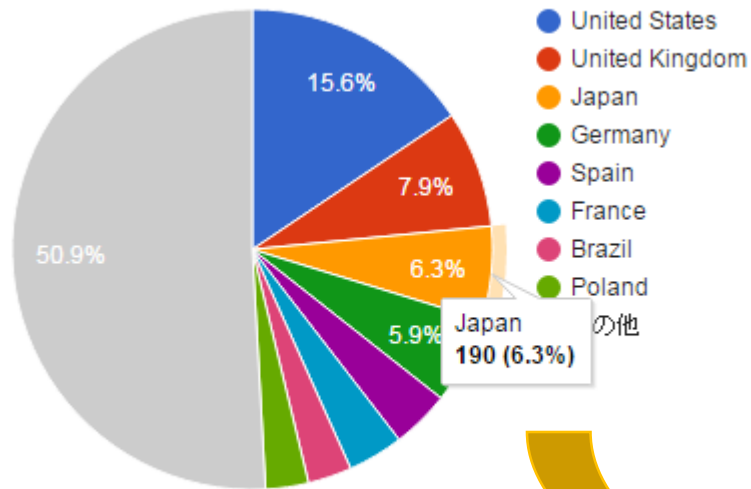

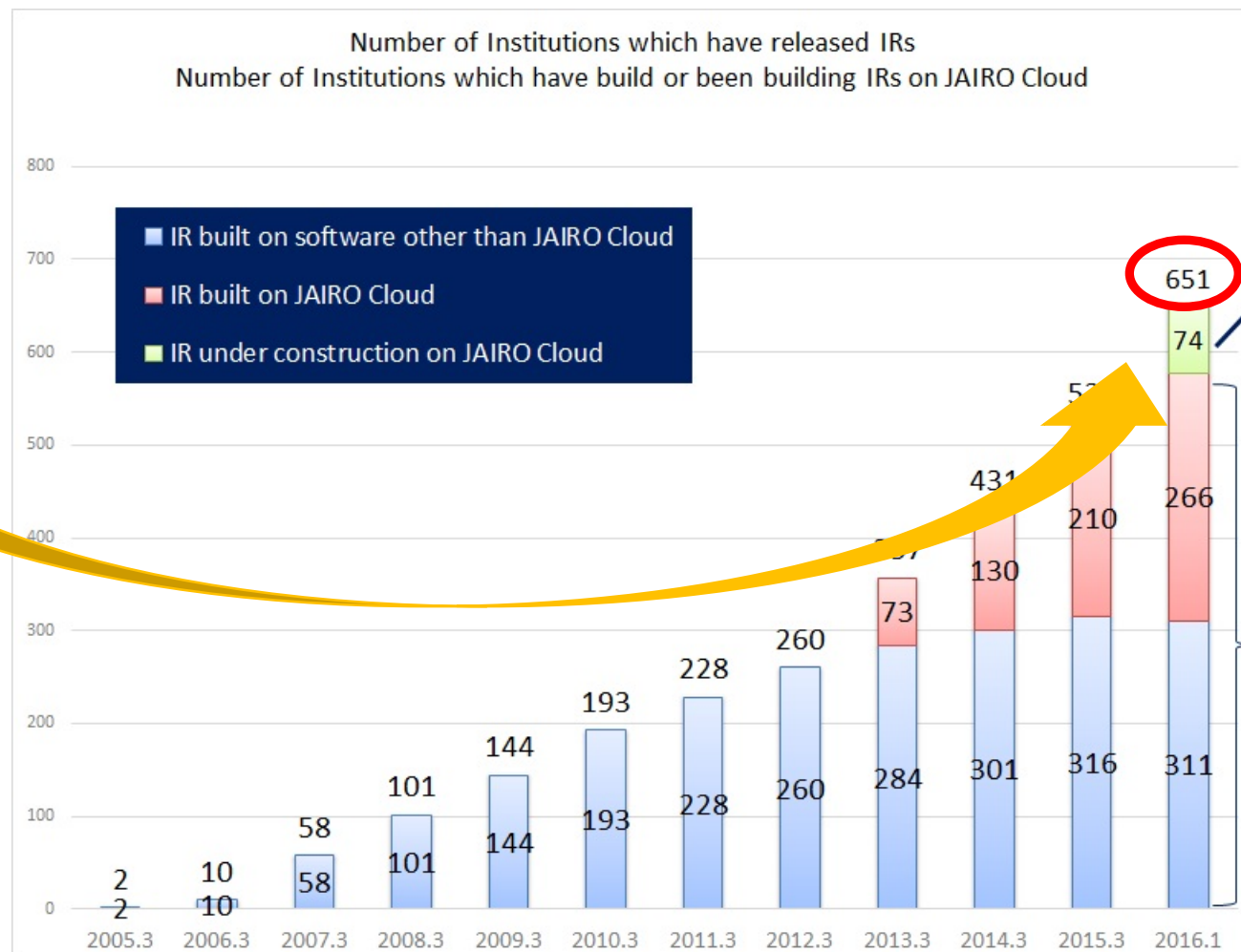
# Number of Japanese Institutional Repository (2015)

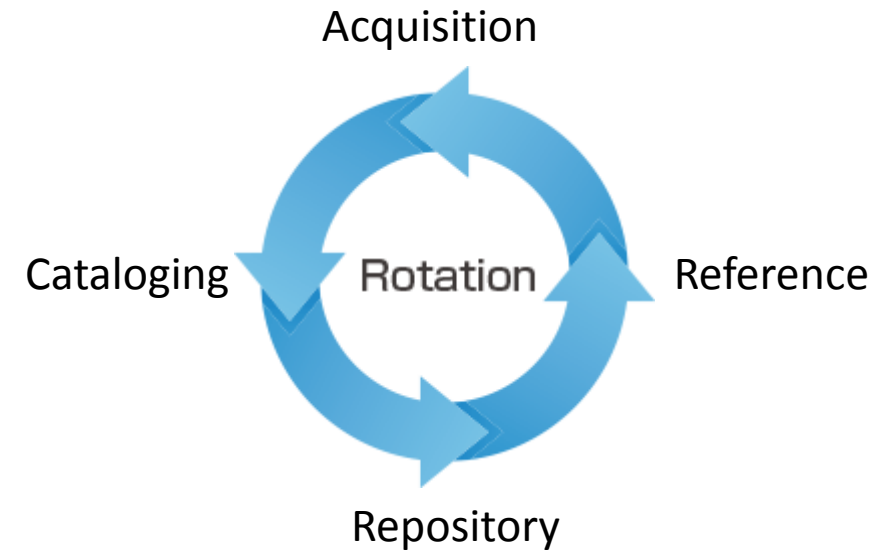
# Working environment (background)

## ✓ Job-rotation system

- Most of repository manager will change his/her position within **2 ~ 3 years**
  - Appointed system (e.g. project manager) is not available in Japanese working environment
  - Some are not only librarian but also clerical staff

## ◆ Problems

- Not transferring repository's know-how
- Not lasting “right man in the right place”

- ✓ Low visibility of Japanese activities

  - OpenDOAR, ROARMAP, etc...

  - “Why do not Japanese librarians register their own repository with OpenDOAR?”

- ✓ Lack of institution’s vision / policy

  - Cannot show the perspective of each efforts

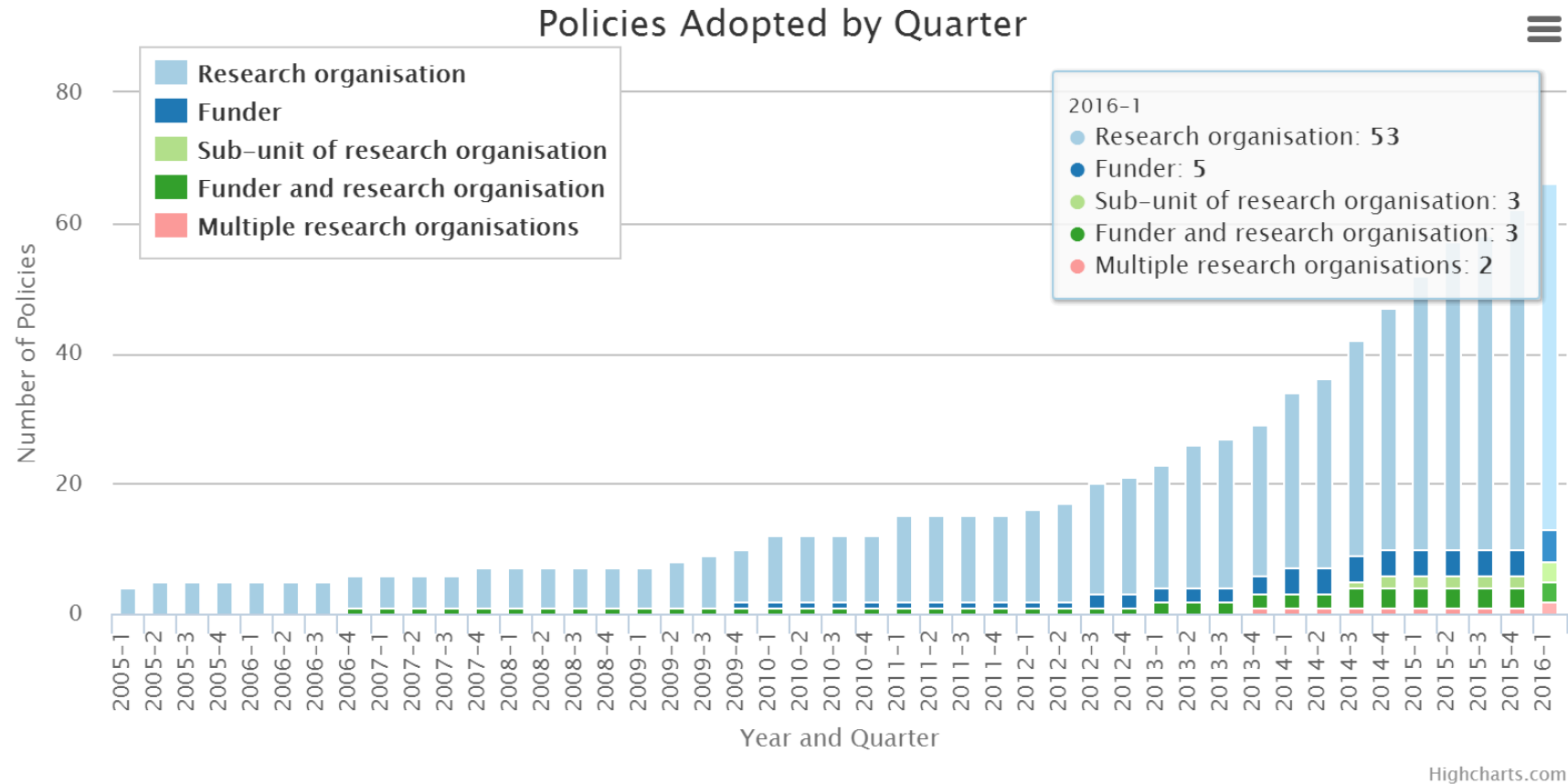
  - “Vision / Policy” is necessary element for international cooperation

- ✓ For more distribution...
