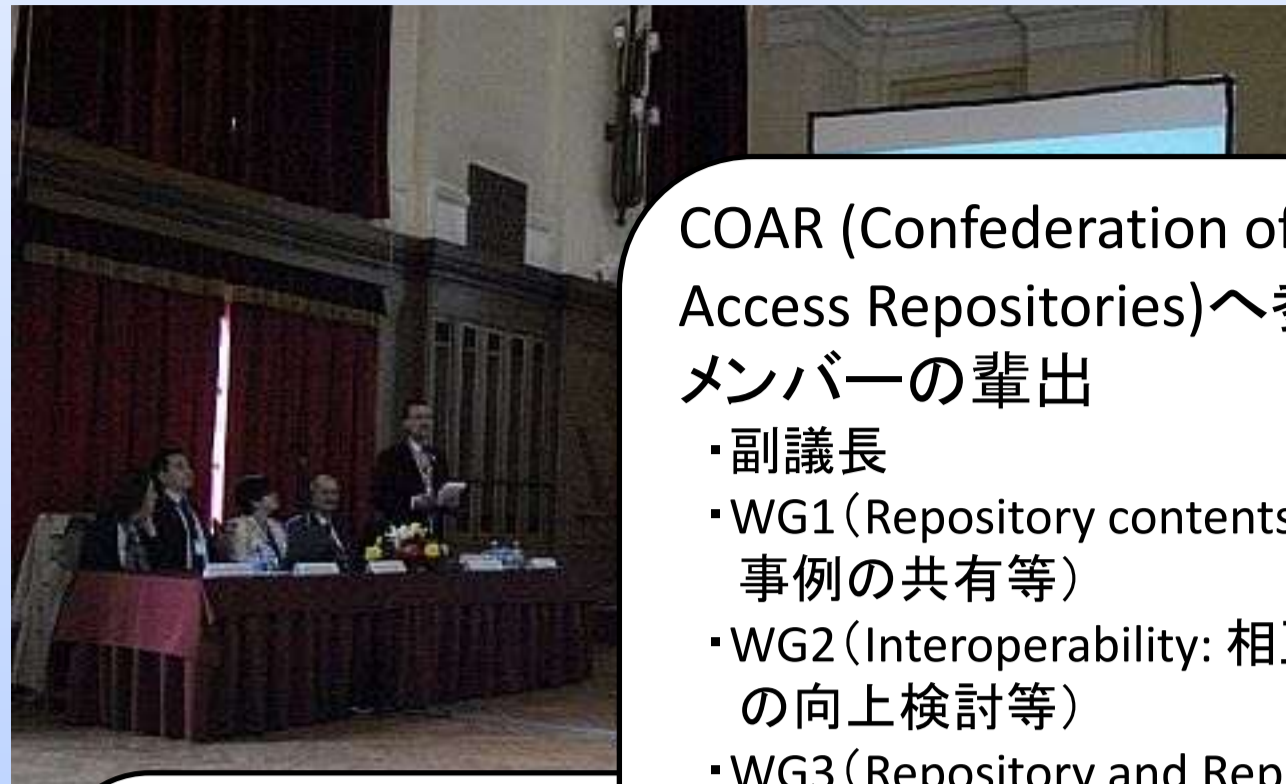

I wanted to make sure you all saw this latest brochure developed by our colleagues in Japan promoting Open Access. It was produced by the Digital Repositories Federation in Japan, and is a wonderful update on the consistent progress that our colleagues have been making in Open access, education, advocacy and adoption.

The report is titled "hita-hita" - a truly fitting term that means the slow and gentle (but relentless!) adoption of a new idea or method. The Japanese repository community certainly epitomizes this, having implemented 135 digital repositories over the past five years, which means that Japan as a country now ranks second in the world in sheer numbers of repositories.

The report also contains some nice advocacy materials that can be adapted on campuses - I particularly like the outline of the skit that helps to broach the discussion of "taxpayer access to taxpayer funded research" on campus!

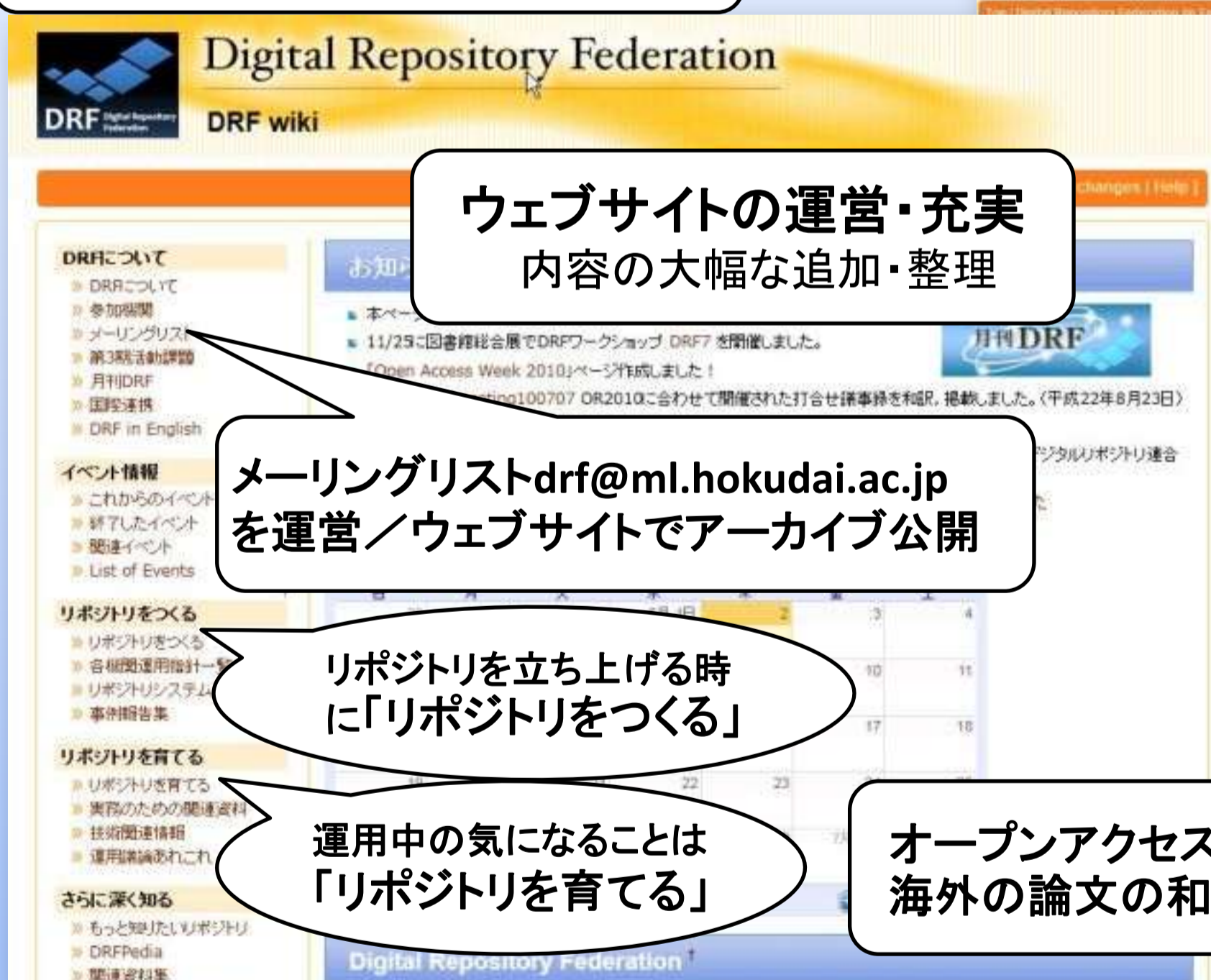

"The term "hita-hita" was employed to signify something that penetrates gently and smoothly. As of 2011, a total of 760,000 research papers are accessible through IRs across Japan. Open Access (OA) is not politically forced at state level or institution level. Instead, we have built repository manager-level lateral solidarity to share experience, exchange various creative ideas, add improvements and disseminate them to the respective IRs."
